Air Show:

A variety of activities, from gobbling up pancakes to gazing at vintage autos, accompanies the annual air show which gets the Spring Fling under way.

The air show at the Big Bear Airport Saturday, May 26 will feature stunt pilot Jim Lasley and his Aerial Circus, parachute jumps by the California Aerial Circus, Warbird fly-overs, a San Bernardino Sheriff's Department helicopter demonstration, Swift aircraft fly-overs, an Army helicopter demonstration, and an Ultralight demonstration. Airplane rides will be offered.

Gates will open at 8 a.m. for the all-day event, with admission charges of \$1 per person or \$3 per family.

The Kiwanis Club's pancake breakfast will be served from 7 to 11:30 a.m. west of the terminal. Prices are \$2.50 for adults and \$1.50 for children under 12.

The Big Bear Lake Antique and Classic Car Club will have some of its members' autos on display at the airport. Some of the distaff members will put on a fashion show, modeling apparel Speaking Frankly Fashions.

At 6 p.m., Aero Specialties will begin serving a barbecue dinner. The tickets, priced at \$5 for adults and \$2.50 for children, also allow patrons to be entertained by the Good Old Boys Band.
